Primary School Review

Thank you to the parents who gave up their time to be part of the parent focus group and meet with the inspection team. We received many encouraging comments and feedback was very positive. Once I receive the final written report we will make an action plan to address any areas for improvement highlighted in the report and this will be shared with all parents/carers. I am extremely grateful to our hard working staff team who spoke with and shared learning and teaching (including class observations) with the inspection team.

In-service days

Staff from Eassie and Glamis came together at a Kirriemuir Cluster School's joint meeting held in Northmuir Primary. We had a very interesting and thought provoking presentation from staff from the Educational Development Service on Early Literacy and staff appreciated the opportunity to network with other teachers in the cluster and share practice. We returned to school in the afternoon to plan our Paired Reading programme which will begin early next term (a letter explaining this initiative will be sent home next term). The following day we had a presentation from a colleague from Perth and Kinross on Mental maths and later planned a programme which will be delivered next term in each class.

Reading Week

This was an action packed week full of super reading activities. The children worked co-operatively to create characters from fairy tales, design leaflets and posters promoting reading to children, flow charts summarising key events in stories and enjoyed a visit from local author, Sylvia Troon. Sylvia shared tips for story writing and used her amazing puppets to read some of her stories to the children. The week ended with parents invited in to school to read with the children and for the children to share their learning with parents and carers.

Drama workshop

P1/2/3 enjoyed a visit from an Angus Council drama facilitator who dramatized the story of The Little Red Riding Hood to develop literacy skills with the children.

Superstar Corner

Thomas Duffy visited the P6/7 class at Glamis and gave a presentation on World War II aircraft to help them with their World War II topic. His presentation was excellent and he shared his extensive knowledge and ably answered some quite challenging questions. Well done, Thomas!

Emergency School Closure Procedures

During the winter months schools can sometimes be disrupted by severe weather. We recognise it is important that our school remains open so parents are able to work and pupils can continue to learn – and so we will remain open if at all possible. However, if we do experience severe snow/ice resulting in hazardous conditions, we occasionally have to take the difficult decision to close the school during the school day. Once this decision has been made we will notify parents via telephone.



Decisions to close or keep open individual schools prior to the start of the school day will be posted to the Angus Council website (www.angus.gov.uk) on the "School Status" page. If a decision has been taken the previous day information will also be available on Tay Connect (0844 855 1724) select option 1 for Angus school information or option 2 for Angus bus information and /or Angus council's ACCESSLine (08452 777 778) and will also be broadcast on Radio Tay when available. Information will also be updated via Twitter @anguscouncil or facebook at facebook.com/anguscouncil or on Tay Connect (0844 855 1724).

A Home Work Grid for each class will be posted on the pupil pages of the school website (usually writing, science and maths activities which relate to the snow) and we would encourage your child to complete some of these during the day – as well as continue with reading and tables practice.

What can you do to help?

- Don't forget suitable warm clothing gloves, hats, scarves, wellies etc. or even a change of clothing. We always allow the children to play outside and wellies are a MUST!
- If you are a working parent and might have a problem with a sudden earlier pick up, please put a back-up plan in place with another family member or parent and inform the school. This will allow staff to leave earlier for their safety if weather dictates.
- Please ensure that we have an up to date telephone number at all times as emergencies can, and do happen. Even if a school is open during severe weather conditions, parents are entitled to keep their children at home if they have any safety concerns whatsoever.
